of the Village of Shelly, Herman County, Minn.

ORDINANCE NO. 6.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE PLAYING OF CARDS, USE OF SLOT MACHINES, DICE AND THE SALE OF TONIC OR HARD CIDER IN RESTAURANTS, TEMPERANCE SALOONS AND PLACES WHERE SOFT DRINKS ARE SOLD, IN THE VILLAGE OF SHELLY. The Village Council of the Village of Shelly do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for the keeper, his agent or employee, of any Restaurant, Temperance Saloon or of any place where so called soft drinks are kept for sale, to permit the playing of cards, use of slot machines and dice or to sell Tonic or Hard Cider in any such place so kept by him.

Sec. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than five dollars, nor more than fifteen dollars and the costs of prosecution and in default of the payment thereof be committed to the Village Lockup or to the County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
